A PERSONAL EXPERIENCE

From Lion Gail Cordes, LCIF District Coordinator

In February, PID Ed and I were fortunate to join a group of about 20 other Lions from the US plus Lions from the UK and Greece, to help the Lions of Kenya in a Global Week of Service. During this project the group did a diabetes screening, did vision screening on almost 2000 children including many attending a special Olympics event, planted trees, and helped feed the children in two schools, including a Masai school. Soccer balls that emitted sound were given to each of the students at a school for the blind and visually impaired. Wheelchairs were donated to a school for physically challenged students. Young women in several schools were given enough hygiene kits to last a year so they wouldn't have to miss a couple of days of class each month. All of this was funded by a grant from LCIF. District Governors from Delaware and Kenya teamed up to sponsor the grant request.

The experience was overwhelming, humbling, inspiring, and motivating.

If you have been thinking about donating to LCIF, there is no time like the present. Whether you donate to the disaster relief fund or one of the service areas, or just to the general fund, the need is there. Between the war in Ukraine, the earthquake in Turkey and Syria, the floods in Brazil, or any of the other world-wide disasters, many emergency assistance grants have been disbursed. There is also a continuing need to fund projects involving childhood cancer, diabetes, vision, hunger, and the environment. Last year over \$35 million dollars were given in grants around the world, including almost \$4 million in the US.








Hector Area Lions






We have an information table set up once a month at the Hazlitt Oasis in efforts to gain more members and tell the community how we can and do help.


senior awards ceremony. The Kiley Award is presented to a student with good grades who is especially active in community service.



The original Pal-Mac Lions Club was chartered in January 1929. Partnering with the King's Daughters Organization the new Club decorated the Village Christmas trees and furnished food baskets. In 1933 the Club, with dwindling assets and memberships due to the Depression, returned its charter to Lions International. The group continued without a charter serving the communities until 1944 when a new charter was granted. The Pal-Mac Club has served our communities for over 92 continuous years.

The mission is the same as it was in 1929. The needs are still the same as they have always been. Our largest yearly fundraiser, providing the majority of our funds has been a food concession trailer at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints' ten day Hill Cumorah Pageant. After 83 years it has been permanently discontinued. Our greatest challenge is developing new fundraising opportunities for the continuation of the services and support we have always been able to provide.
